Four at OCS Earn Advanced Placement Scholar Awards

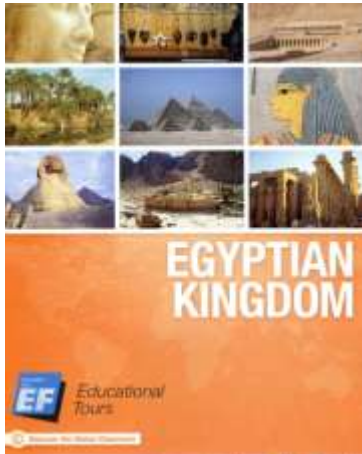
Four recent graduates of Ouachita Christian School have earned AP Scholar Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on AP Exams. **Jim Boothe**, earned the Advanced Placement Scholar with Distinction Award. **Morgan Anthony**, **Martha Grace Givler**, and **Ginnie Wang** each earned the Advanced Placement Scholar Award.

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program® provides motivated and academically prepared students with the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school, and to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. About 18 percent of the nearly 1.7 million students worldwide who took AP Exams performed at a sufficiently high level to also earn an AP Scholar Award. Ouachita Christian School offers students the opportunity to earn credit in seven different Advanced Placement courses.

Boothe qualified for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams. Anthony, Givler, and Wang qualified for the AP Scholar Award by completing three or more AP Exams with grades of 3 or higher.

Boothe is enrolled at Louisiana Tech, Anthony attends Rice University, Givler is enrolled at Wheaton College, and Wang is attending Baylor University.
